GENERAL REGULATIONS

General Regulations and Acceptance of Entries

- 1. Judging will be performed by a Judge or panel of Judges appointed by the Society.
- 2. The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Qld Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc. and the Association relevant to this schedule, in addition to any Special Regulations appearing in this schedule. Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Qld Chamber of Agricultural Societies or the Association relevant to this schedule.
- 3. No refunds will be made after close of entry.
- 4. The Society will accept any donations, trophies or gifts. All donations, gifts, trophies are non-refundable & become property of the Society once received by or handed in to Society Office.
- All competitors must pay online, before entering the grounds. Office payment at discretion of Society.
- 6. Prizemoney to be claimed on show day. Unclaimed prizemoney or nomination refunds will be forfeited after 1 month, with a minimum chq posted of \$5.00 & postage deducted from winnings.
- 7. No organization or private entity may hold raffles or donation boxes on the grounds during show day. The Society reserves the right to use its discretion as required & decision is final.

Notice to intending Exhibitors/Competitors

- 8. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibit and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the society blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from such accidents.
- The Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accident on the grounds or premises.
- 10. The committee reserves the right to determine any matter not covered by the rules, regulations and bylaws.
- 11. Entries/nominations for the upcoming Agricultural Show relevant to this schedule can be made as described for each section in this schedule. Entries submitted other than on the correct form will be returned to the Exhibitor and, unless all requirements are complied with, and the forms returned to the Agricultural Society office by completion of business on the closing date, as shown in this Schedule, they will not be considered.
- 12. Notwithstanding the provisions of General Regulation 11, late entries/nominations may be accepted at the discretion of the Secretary or relevant Section Steward.
- 13. Exhibitors whose entries have not been accepted shall be advised accordingly and entry fees refunded
- 14. The exhibitor irrevocably consents to the Association publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet. This includes all photos/videos taken of exhibits/competitors/events.
- 15. All livestock must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 16. Entries in livestock sections will be taken as guarantee that the exhibit is free from disease. In case of infectious diseases being spread through a violation of this regulation, the exhibitor must take the consequences.
- 17. No protest in ring events will be accepted unless lodged with the Secretary within fifteen minutes of judging or display of prize cards. The protest must be accompanied by a non-refundable \$20.00 fee.
- 18. Registered horse classes if any protest is entered, papers need to be available for inspection on show day.



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


